Line two: Preposition + descriptive noun phrase [+ comma]

Line three: Preposition + descriptive noun phrase [+ comma]

Line one: Subject + Verb *or* Verb + Subject [+period]

An example preposition poem:

Over the frozen river,
On a snowy, wooded path at midnight,
Between trees that resemble giants,
Flies our horse-drawn carriage.



Above the root-scarred soil,
Below the gnarly tree's branches,
In front of the August lakeshore,
Hangs the swing that started it all.
